- » Bragging about an upcoming planned attack
- » Depression or anxiety
- » Gun Violence / Violence
- » Harassment
- » Hopelessness, excessive guilt or worthlessness
- » Substance abuse
- » Suicide threats, cutting or other self-harm


Wednesday, September 11, 1:45-3:15 PM LAHS Aux Gym
